In terms of Crime, there were 11 incidents, which is broken down on the next page.

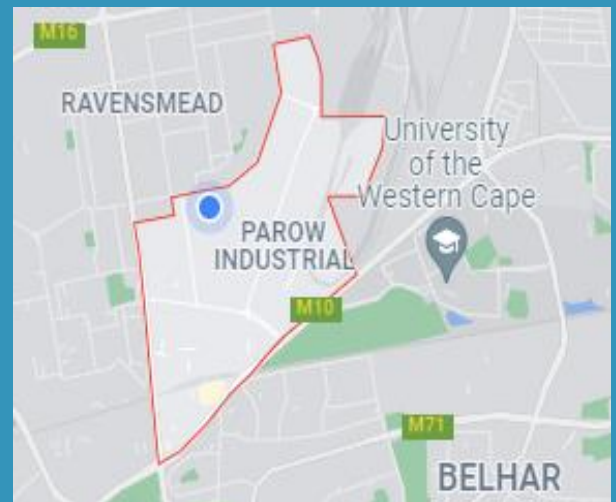
There were incidents on 1 January and then again on 29 January where the same vehicle was involved. The vehicle drives past persons walking in Junction Road. Stops next to them and grabs their bags and then speeds out of the area. The vehicles registration was given through to SAPS for follow up, but unfortunately the number plates are stolen or cloned – SAPS is still investigating at time of sending this newsletter. Both incidents occurred on a Saturday. Please inform your workers to be vigilant in terms of surroundings and a white golf with CA registration and to walk in groups where possible, when working over weekends. They should also have the CID control room number handy (021 932 4800/ 072 197 5001) and ask for patrols on the route to be walked, should they feel unsafe due to few other pedestrians at certain times.

## **REACTIVE INCIDENTS FOR JANUARY 2022**

**1 January 2022** : Robbery at Junction circle – white golf stopped next to pedestrian and stole his bag before speeding out of area.

**3 January 2022** : Business robbery in Stellenberg Road – computers stolen.

**4 January 2022**: Business robbery in Assegai Road – computers stolen.

**12 January 2022**: Possession of stolen goods in Assegai Road- arrest made.

**13 January 2022**: Trespassing and attempted theft in Assegai Road-arrest made

**18 January 2022** : Theft of ladder from premises in Radnor Road

**20 January 2022**: Theft from inside a premises in business hours in Spin Street.

**27 January 2022**: Theft inside premises in Koets street – arrest made

**29 January 2022**: Attempted robbery in Junction Road- white golf stopped next to a pedestrian and attempted to rob him. Pedestrian ran to the nearest business security and the vehicle sped off.

**30 January 2022**: Robbery of persons cellphone and cash who was chased from Belhar railway to just inside the CID geographical boundary in Stellenberg Road.

**31 January 2022**: Vehicle broken into on premises of business in Junction Road.

### **REQUEST TO BUSINESS OWNERS ON BIN DAYS ( THURSDAYS ) :**

It is noted that persons searching for recyclables unpack entire bins on the pavement and then leave behind a mess.

I would like to make a request that any recyclables ( plastic bottles, cooldrink tins, plastic or cardboard are put in black bags and left next to the bin so that the informal collector can take the black bag and leave, without unpacking the bin. We attempt as far as possible to prevent this bin digging/sorting, but it is a cumbersome process and we are not always successful.

If everyone can assist, we will be providing persons who are just trying to put food on the table a dignified way of getting to the recyclables as they wont have to dig in the bin, and the flip side is that there will be less mess in the area for the CID cleaners to pick up, which will free them up to attend to other issues such as drain clearing, weeding etc. Currently Thursdays are a whole day spent just picking up litter.

Your consideration of this request and if/where possible, separate baging of recyclables from other waste as indicated, would be most appreciated.
