FEBRUARY 2025

Good afternoon, business owners.

Attached find crime for the month of February 2025. There was one proactive incident and one with entry and exit from outside the CID geographical borders. See details hereunder. For the corresponding period in the previous year there had been 6 incidents. So, Crime in Parow Industria is still steadily decreasing.

Water and Sanitation have confirmed that the 21 outstanding water reinstatements will be dealt with from 1 April 2025 when a contractor is expected to be on site.

Grass cutting will be done from 10 March by a CID contracted service provider.

The 5-year maintenance to 3 of the area's substations took place without incident. Those who were affected are thanked for their patience.

Business owners are sensitized to keep your "shop fronts" clean and free of weeds. Especially portions of yard which are fenced off but visible from the street. If everyone does their bit and the CID cleaners keep the public spaces clean of litter and weeds, it makes for a clean area where people are more likely to do business. Please also check your electric fencing/barbed wire on top of walls that they are free of plastic bags that get swept up and caught there on windy days.

The CID has reported the 4 sites in the area where there are potholes. The Arnold Wilhelm Depot manager has informed that they were waiting on tar on 17 February 2025. A reminder was sent today, and it is hoped that they will be on site shortly. The CID is aware of the state of the potholes and will follow up until finalized.

Business owners are sensitized to call the **CID control room on 021 932 4800/ 072 197 5001 in cases of emergency and not to phone me.**

Valuable time is wasted when I need to relay the message, and I am also not always on site. Also bear in mind that when you dial the control room number above, you need to give it a minute- you might not hear it ring your side, but it does ring our side, and the phone **will be answered 24/7, 365 days a year!**

Our controllers are trained to divert to the necessary authorities required if the emergency requires more than intervention by CID responders. They will also make the necessary follow ups until such authorities are on site e.g. ambulance, fire brigade, SAPS etc, whilst doing the necessary camera monitoring with CID responders dispatched to assist in the interim.

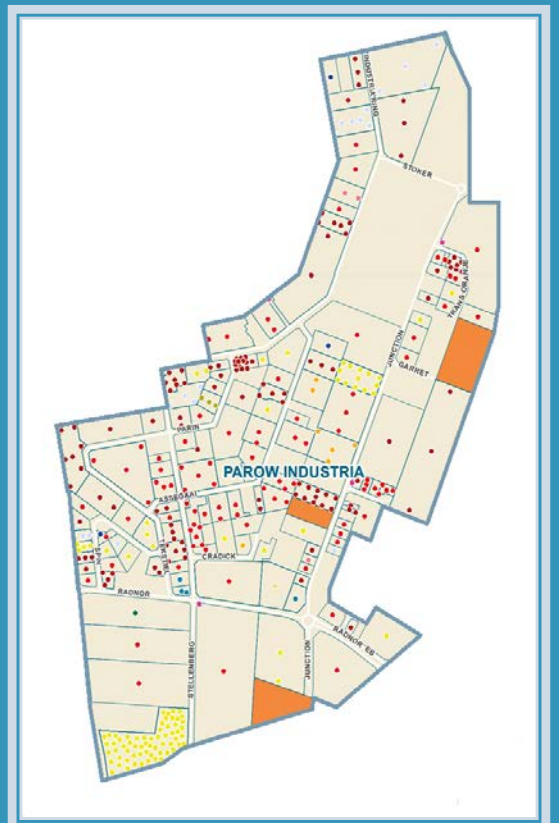

CRIME INCIDENTS FOR FEBRUARY 2025: 2 INCIDENTS

(1 X INCIDENT TAKING PLACE ON PRIVATE PREMISES AND 1 X PROACTIVE INCIDENT WHERE NOTHING WAS STOLEN)

01 February 2025 @ approximately 01:45: Proactive : *Attempted Theft of Truck Cables: Stellenberg Road*

At 01h45 the control room spotted 2 x males walking from Belhar Railway, entering Stellenberg Road. A CID patrol vehicle was immediately dispatched. Both males walked past a truck parked in Stellenberg Road opposite Millennium Park, and was then spotted trying to do something by the side of the truck.

On arrival of the CID response vehicle the males were seen running from the area. The truck driver reported nothing was stolen and added that he always removes the truck cables before he goes to sleep.

08 February 2025 @ approximately 20:57: *Robbery of hand radio with a firearm: Stellenberg Road (Private Premises/entry and exit from outside the CID geographical area))*

At 20h57 on Saturday 08/02/25 a CID patrol vehicle reported that they were approached by the On-site Security at the building site situated opposite Pep Gate 1. The onsite security informed that he had been robbed inside his guardroom by 1x male who had a Firearm. This male had allegedly jumped over the fence from Robert Sobukwe side from between the bushes. The male allegedly took the company hand radio before fleeing. Ravensmead SAPS was contacted by the CID to attend to the scene. Camera playback was done by the control room, but as this area is private property and due to the hill and bushes, the entry and exit of the male was not caught on the CID camera system.

TRAFFIC FINE ROADSHOW DRIVES TO PAROW

The popular traffic fine roadshow will be visiting Parow from the 14 to 19 March 2025 to afford motorists another opportunity to pay outstanding fines and settle warrants.

The City of Cape Town's Traffic Service, in collaboration with Municipal Courts, Revenue Services, and other key departments, will host its annual **public roadshow at the Parow Civic Centre, corner of Voortrekker and Talent Streets, Parow**. The previous roadshow in December last year assisted more than 3 000 persons who made representations on 34 509 outstanding fines and warrants. The monetary value of the fines and warrants paid amounted to nearly R7 million.

The following operating days and hours will apply.

18/03/2025	Tuesday	08:30 to 12:30	Members of the public including bulk reduction applications or representation.
19/03/2025	Wednesday	08:30 to 14:00	Members of the public including bulk reduction applications or representation.

IMPORTANT NOTICE – The City is not bound by the times as indicated in the above grid and reserves the right to start or stop and cut queues during the roadshow at any time deemed necessary.

This initiative provides residents and City staff with an opportunity to resolve outstanding fines, summonses, warrants, as well as inquire about municipal accounts. The following services will be available:

- All fine-related enquiries for vehicles registered in your name
- Apply for reductions on traffic fines issued within the City of Cape Town's municipal boundaries
- Pay or finalise outstanding fines
- Inquire about warrants or summonses issued in your name and settle them
- Remove administration marks from your name in the Natis system, enabling you to renew your vehicle licence or complete other Natis transactions
- Municipal account inquiries. We offer various benefits that the client can apply for viz: Indigent and Pensioner Rebates Benefits. The clients can also make payment arrangements if they have arrears on their respective municipal accounts. The client must have copies of their IDs, drivers licence, proof of income, affidavits if they don't have bank accounts and consent letters if they are not the owners of the property they are residing at.

Please note that redirections of traffic fines, no admission of guilt fines (NAG fines) and reducing a fine that has already been reduced will not be entertained at the Roadshow. In addition, contempt of court amounts (Warrant amount of R300/R600) cannot be reduced by a prosecutor.

If you have a traffic matter and are unable to attend in person, you may send a representative on your behalf. The representative will need to present the following documents:

- Their own Identity Document (ID)
- A copy of the ID of the person they are representing
- An affidavit granting them permission to act on the individual's behalf

The City would like to encourage all residents to take advantage of this opportunity to resolve any outstanding matters with the City of Cape Town. 'This is another opportunity for motorists and vehicle owners to check if they have any outstanding warrants or fines. Our traffic fine roadshows are not only an opportunity to pay fines, but also to increase awareness on road and traffic safety and to remind motorists to drive responsibly and to adhere to road and traffic safety regulations. Motorists are invited to visit the roadshow ahead of the long weekend and ensure that there are no outstanding fines or warrants on their name,' said Mayoral Committee Member for Safety and Security, Alderman Smith.
